SAN FRANCISCO (Nov. 29, 2021)—Indie tech-book publisher No Starch Press is joining forces with [Humble Bundle](#) to offer a curated mix of popular hacking and security titles at a pay-what-you-want price, for a worthy cause. This special three-week deal builds upon a hugely popular collaboration with the digital gaming storefront, that’s raised over \$2.1 million for charitable organizations to date.

The “[HACKING by No Starch Press](#)” ebook bundle runs now through Dec. 20, and benefits [Let’s Encrypt](#)—a nonprofit certificate authority launched by the Internet Security Research Group (ISRG)—as well as the [No Starch Press Foundation](#), a 501(c)(3) created by the company’s founder, Bill Pollock, to support global hacker communities and STEM initiatives.

This event marks the first time No Starch Press has directly supported Let’s Encrypt’s international mission to create a safer and more secure Web, Pollock said. “It’s hard to overstate the importance of using HTTPS on every website. Not only does Let’s Encrypt provide free certificates for creating HTTPS connections, they make the process easy and transparent – which is critical to widespread adoption.”

According to ISRG executive director Josh Aas, the sentiment is mutual. “We are thankful to the No Starch Press team for including us in this bundle,” he noted. “No Starch’s support of our nonprofit organization goes a long way as we continue to make the Web more privacy-respecting for people around the world.”

The promotion’s PWYW model means customers choose between various pricing tiers of ebooks, then decide how much of their purchase goes to each charity.
